If You Know...

MT. 13:1-3,10-17

"This is why I speak to them in parables, because seeing they do not see, and hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand."

(Matthew 13:13, ESV)

Review the Sermon Read Mt. 13:10-17. Why were parables significant at this point in Jesus' ministry? What is the only way we can know truth about God? Do we discover it for ourselves? How is Jesus himself the key to unlocking the treasures in these parables? Assess your Life Have you ever found biblical assertions to be difficult to understand or accept? Do you struggle with the idea that God gives knowledge of himself to some while hiding it from others? How aware are you of your own depravity (rebellion toward God) apart from God's great work of salvation?

How can you become more honest with your questions and doubts when struggling with
difficult biblical claims? How can you seek solid answers?
How should your prayer life change if God alone reveals truth to people?
How should your worship be enhanced with knowing that God revealed Jesus Christ to you
purely by his grace, with no influence from yourself?

Will you determine before God to wrestle honestly with the difficult claims of the Bible and
always surrender to the authority of God's Word?
