## Review the Sermon

Review the Settion
Read Matthew 13:44-46.
After reading these two short parables, what would you say is the difference between religious people and a true citizen of God's kingdom?
Verses 44 and 46 provide a similar template for a kingdom-centered life of joyful motivation, intentional direction, unreserved sacrifice, and focused investment. Why is a proper motivation of joy the key to your direction, sacrifice, and investment?
Assess your Life
How have you struggled with improper motivation for living the Christian life? Have you had times when your joy was lacking?
Do you find your joy in the Lord leading to greater seriousness about what you are doing with your life?
Do you spend more time and energy avoiding sin (sacrifice) or pursuing holiness (investment)?

Apply the Truth
What steps can you take to restore or maximize the joy of your salvation?
How can you maintain a balance of joyfulness and seriousness as you intentionally live for God's kingdom and glory?
What other areas of life can you apply this template of motivation, direction, sacrifice, and investment? (examples: marriage, family, career, etc.)
Commit this week to
Finding joy in knowing Christ, intentionally pursuing his will, sacrificing whatever stands in the way, and investing in activity that promises eternal reward.
