"Then Peter came up and said to him, "Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy-seven times." (Matthew 18:21–22, ESV)

Will you commit to surrendering your hurts to King Jesus, and taking active steps to let go
of the obligation, and show mercy to the person who has caused you harm?
