If you find yourself doubting your salvation, how can you focus on Jesus rather than the quality of your faith?

What can be done to avoid personal boasting?

How can you ensure that all aspects of your life are defined by gospel-centered faith?

Will you commit this week to a renewed appreciation of what Jesus has paid for you to be right with God?
