ROMANS 5:1-11

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God." (Romans 5:1–2, ESV)

How does your hope need to be refined and purified through adversity? What false
expectations are you basing your hope on (that must be removed)?
How can you gain a deeper sense of God's love for you as a believer?
How can you help others in the Christian community to overcome their struggles with
despair and hopelessness?
